

## Table of Course Fees for Independent Students commencing Autumn 2026

There are two component parts to the fees charged by Lindisfarne for its Durham University validated programme of study: an annual registration fee and a fee per module, all payable to Lindisfarne.

Most Lindisfarne students study on a part-time basis, taking 40, 60 or 80 credits per year. Full-time students take 120 credits per year. Check the LCT webpage (<https://www.lindisfarnect.org/study-with-us/our-courses/>) to confirm how many credits per year you would normally study on your chosen course.

Lindisfarne was formed to provide accessible study of theology to people in the North East and is therefore able to offer all its independent students a reduced rate (compared to the normal costs of studying at an English university.)

Fees for the 2025-26 academic year	
Annual Registration Fee	£770 – this covers our full range of administrative charges
Module cost - Undergraduate	£600 per 20 credit module £300 per 10 credit module
Module cost - Postgraduate	£675 per 20 credit module
Dissertations	A 40-credit undergraduate dissertation = 2 x £600 = £1200 A 60-credit postgraduate dissertation = 3 x £675 = £2025

Sample 2025-26 course costs	A half-time undergraduate certificate year involving 60 credits = £2570 = £770 registration + (3 x £600 per 20 credits) A part-time undergraduate diploma year involving 80 credits = £3170 = £770 registration + (4 x £600 per 20 credits) A part-time postgraduate year involving 60 credits = £2795 = £770 registration + (3 x £675 per 20 credits)
Please note:	Fees are reviewed (and normally raised) annually and initial fee levels do not carry through to your subsequent years of study. Flexible payment plan options are available – see the Payment Methods section for more information.

## Auditing Modules

It is also possible to attend and engage in additional modules as an Auditor. To 'audit' a module in this way means full class participation, but not completing the assignments or gaining module credit or an award. This possibility is at the discretion of the relevant Director of Studies.

If you are only auditing modules, and not taking any modules for credit/award, then you do not pay an annual registration fee.

There are no course requirements on the set number of modules you may audit per academic year although it is not usually recommended to take more than one per year if you are new to studying theology.

Auditing a 10 credit module = £150.00

Auditing a 20 credit module = £300.00

## Cancellation Policy

### New students

If you accept an offer to study on a Lindisfarne College of Theology programme (following an offer letter from LCT), then you commit to paying the registration fee for the current academic year. Annual registration fees are non-refundable and are required to be paid before you commence study and then before the start of each subsequent academic year. Auditors are not required to pay a registration fee.

### New and continuing students

If you attend two or more teaching sessions for a module, you must pay the full fee for that module. This also applies in the case of Auditors.

### Continuing students

For your second, third or subsequent year of study, the registration fee must always be paid before the new academic year commences.

## Payment Methods

Fees can be paid in one lump payment, termly or by standing order over 10 months. Fees must be paid in full by 30 June in each academic year. The annual registration fee must be paid before teaching commences in any academic year.

Single payments can be made by bank transfer (see account details below). Cheques cannot be accepted. LCT is unable to set up direct debits. Students can set up standing orders with the following details:
